



BPS Acceptable Use Policy Quiz Grades K2-2

A quiz at the primary level has to be very different from a quiz in the upper elementary grades. In K2 and Grade 1, everything will have to be read to and explained to the children. This will be done at the beginning of the school year; most Grade 1 children will not yet have the skills to read this text on their own. Most Grade 2 children will have the reading skills and they will have had some experience with multiple-choice tests in Grade 1.

In K2 and Grade 1, I would suggest a kind of group test. The teacher reads the questions, and asks for answers from the group, making sure that every child understands.
